Happy Fourth of July! It is wonderful to celebrate the freedoms that we enjoy and to be reminded of our unity as a nation. In considering the history of events and circumstances leading to this day in our national history, we might see some similarities in our parish history.

We too began as one parish as the United States started with one colony. St. Mary Parish was founded in 1874 in Lyons. As the colonies grew to 13, we grew to three parishes—St. Mary moved to Riverside in 1901, St. Hugh in Lyons was founded in 1925, Mater Christi began in 1953. As our country celebrates 245 years, we celebrate 147 years since our roots were planted.

This Fourth of July 2021, we celebrate not only our unity as a country but the reuniting of the churches that grew from a single root, branched out, and have come together again. Like the colonies which found strength and purpose in their uniting, St. Paul VI Parish will be stronger and more focused on our purpose: the mission to share the Good News.

St. Paul VI Parish is rich in people with talent and generosity, a variety of competencies and, most importantly, great faith. We are proud to be serving as your priests! Our staff people are individuals who are dedicated to you and to the works they perform on your behalf. But as it “takes a village to raise a child,” it takes every person in a parish to proclaim Jesus through our words and deeds. How will you be involved in our new parish?

The Fourth of July celebrates both unity and independence: the unity of the colonies and independence from foreign rule. We are united now in one parish but united with the whole Church throughout the world, the Mystical Body of Christ. And we have the freedom of all God’s children to fulfill our purpose on earth. As Pope Paul VI said on the feast of Corpus Christi in 1968 we are called to “accept Jesus’ invitation to be one (John 17, 21); to seek to establish harmony and concord among ourselves; to foster what unites us and not what divides us and sets us one against another; to ‘build up the Church’ which is the Mystical Body of Christ.”

We build up the Church first by living our unity, by introducing ourselves to others, by welcoming those who are new to the parish, by outreach to those among us and beyond our community who are in need. We build up the Church by being Church together in worship, in faith formation, in social events to deepen our bonds and in our works of justice and charity.

St. Paul VI Parish has been given new life with strong common roots and the Lord has richly blessed us. What return shall we each make to the Lord for his gift of faith and for our new parish? Consider the time, talent and treasure you have and how you will help us to grow as our ancestors helped St. Mary, St. Hugh and Mater Christi to grow in years past. As the Lord said to Paul in today’s second reading, “My grace is sufficient for you” and so it will be!

Hello Parishioners of St. Paul VI Parish! My name is Fr. Tom May and I am truly humbled and honored to be named the Pastor of the newly unified faith community of St. Hugh, Mater Christi and St. Mary.

I am the second oldest of five children and have two brothers and two sisters. I am blessed that all of my siblings live in the Chicago area. We enjoyed a very typical suburban upbringing in a very Catholic family growing up in Norridge.

I attended Notre Dame High School for Boys in Nilens and graduated DePaul University with a Business Major. When I entered Mundelein Seminary I was referred to as a "Special" because I did not go through the "system" of Quigley and Nilens College, which was typical of almost all seminarians at the time.

I was ordained in 1983 and my first assignment was Associate Pastor at St. Benedict on Irving Park Road in Chicago. Next, was St. Priscilla in Chicago and then St. John Fisher in Chicago. 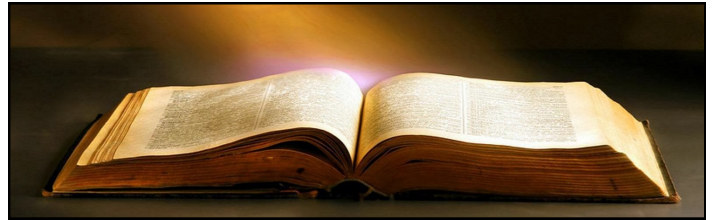

With the echoes of hymns and blessings still playing in our minds and hearts, it is time to offer thanks for our Unification Day celebrations.

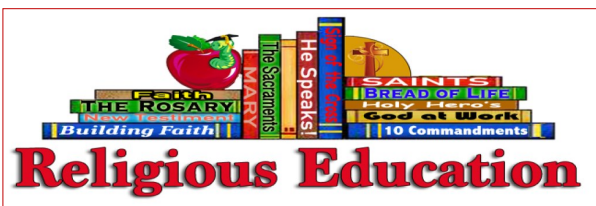
