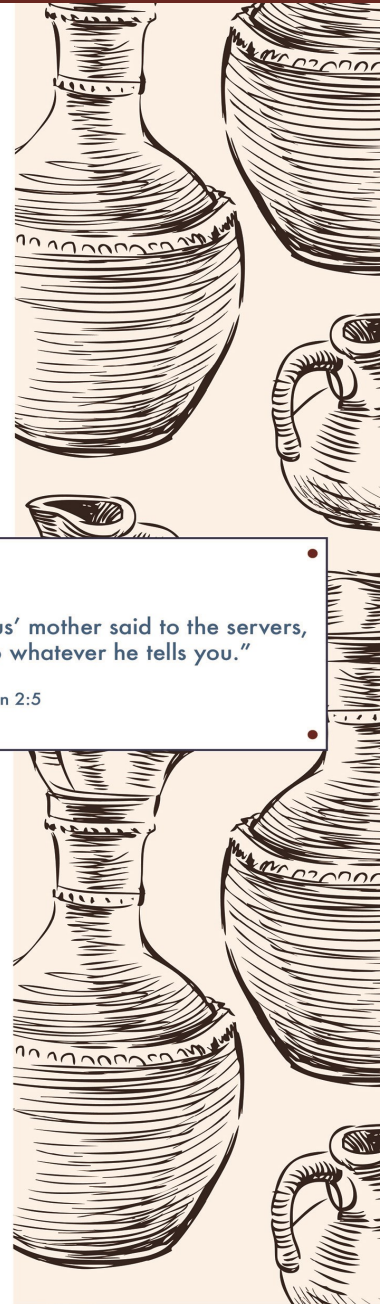

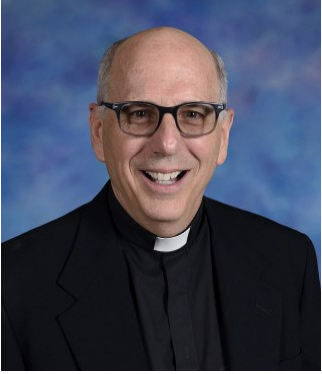

A message from our Pastor



“They have no wine,” Mary said to Jesus in today’s gospel story of the wedding at Cana. We don’t lack wine, perhaps, but there are some glaring issues we face today. We might say, or ask Mary to say to Jesus, “They have no plans” because of covid. Or maybe Our Mother could say, “They are isolated and sad and impatient.” And when Mary told Jesus our plight, what would he say to us?

He told the servers to “fill the jars with water.” What would he ask us to do? Fill your hearts with hope? Or fill your lives with the joy that comes from giving instead of worrying about what you can’t do? Or would he remind us that we are all tired of covid and ask us to be kinder to each other in the struggle to get back to the “new normal?”

In today’s second reading from Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians, he reminds us that we have all been given gifts—the manifestation of the Spirit. While each of us has different gifts, all are given to us “for some benefit.” The benefit is not just for ourselves, but for the community.

There are so many people in our parish who share their gifts willingly and our whole parish benefits. Some are catechists in RE and SPRED, some volunteer in our school, some serve in our liturgical ministries as cantors, lectors, ushers, greeters, musicians, and choir members. Some serve on our Parish Pastoral Council, our Finance Council, or Evangelization Animators Team. Some help lead the Women’s Society or the Holy Name Society or the Knights of Columbus. Some serve on the St. Vincent De Paul Society and our other social outreach efforts, some serve on our Latino Advisory Board, some lead the Alpha team. Some give generously to support us financially and those gifts enable us to survive and to continue serving one another.

Every person who shares their gifts enriches our parish community. As Jesus asked the servers to “fill the jars to the brim.” He expects us to use our gifts to overflowing. Only then will we have enough to quench thirsts, to quell hunger, to provide ministry for those in need of comfort and hope. We are a new parish, and our needs are many. We need everyone’s gifts to help us “fill the jars to the brim.” Not for wine, but for each other.

Mary told the servers, “Do whatever he tells you.” She asks us, too, to listen to what the Lord asks.

A message from our Associate Pastor



The Baptism of the Lord ended our Christmas Season and today we are in the midst of Ordinary Time. Some are glad to be done with the Christmas Season, not because of any malice towards the birth of Christ but because this Christmas was a difficult one. I know many who were planning on going to visit family or go to Mass but getting sick or getting a loved one sick prevented them. It is such a great testament to love to see all the sacrifices that people are making in the care of others. It is an act that we are called to do as a work of mercy to visit those who are sick. We are called to walk with them but as we walk, we can be full of great sadness and difficulty.

It is difficult to feel alone dealing with hardships. It is difficult realizing that many hardships will follow you into 2022. It is difficult to feel stuck. Yet with difficulty, there is hope, we are here for each other as a community and church of St. Paul VI. Please do not be afraid to reach out to others. If you have not seen your churchmate in a while, ask and reach out to that person. If you are struggling and need someone to talk to reach out to us. We know of resources or we can just listen. We probably can't take away the difficulty, but we can hopefully lighten the load. Philip Kosloski of Aleteia helps us understand the way of St. André Bessette, also known as the "Miracle Man of Montreal," who lived from 1845 through 1937. During that time, he witnessed the ravages of World War I, a highly contagious Spanish flu pandemic, and the suffering of many during the Great Depression.

Yet, through it all, he kept his faith in God and devoted himself even more to St. Joseph. What was his secret? According to Pope Benedict XVI in his homily for the canonization of St. André, "For him, believing meant submitting freely and through love to the divine will. Wholly inhabited by the mystery of Jesus, he lived the beatitude of pure of heart, that of personal rectitude." He had a simplicity of heart that was able to endure anything, knowing that God was behind it. Pope Benedict XVI quotes a remarkable saying of St. André that best summarizes his advice on how to weather through any storm in life. "Do not seek to have your trials removed, ask rather for the grace to bear them well." Pope Benedict XVI continues, "For him, everything spoke of God and of God's presence."

For St. André, it wasn't about asking God to remove an obstacle, but for the grace to endure that obstacle, accepting it as if it was from the hand of God. This can be very difficult to accept, as our natural inclination is to try to get rid of any discomfort we may have. However, often we can't eliminate a trial, and we need to instead embrace it and ask God for the grace to endure it well.

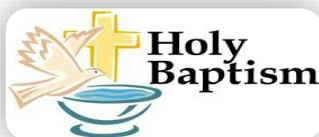

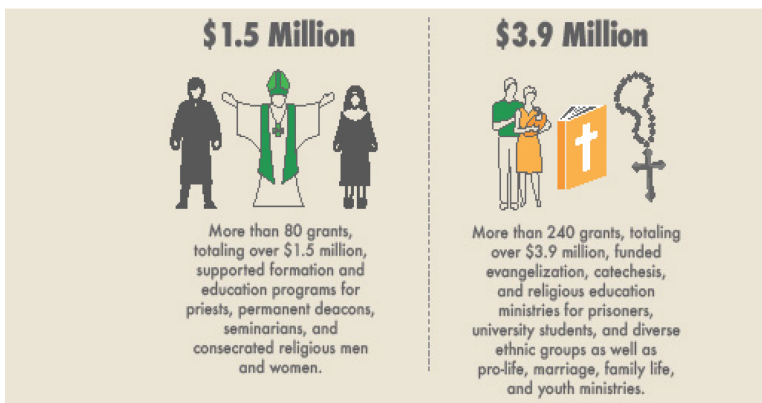

2020 Funding Snapshot (Where Your Donations Go)

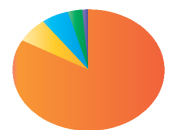

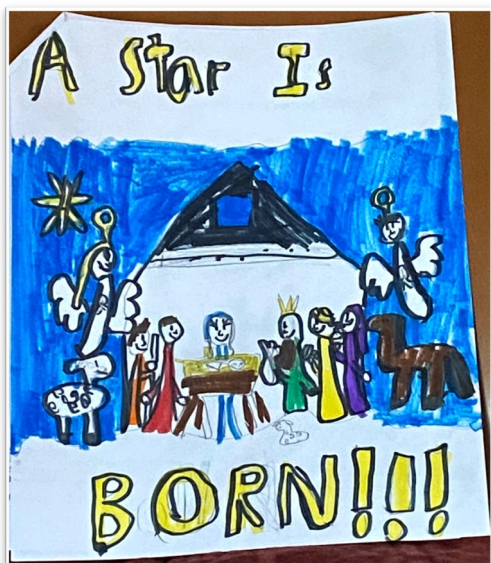

Dine: 6:45-7:15 PM A light meal is shared

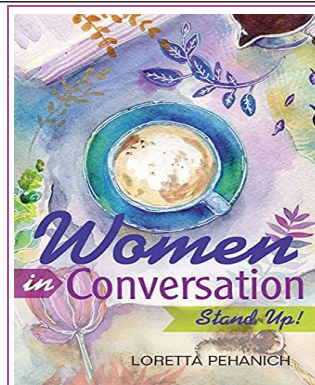

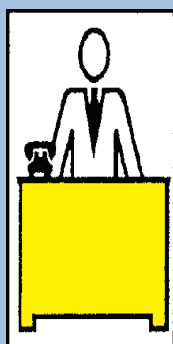
