## A message from our Pastor



Today's Gospel takes place during the Last Supper. Jesus packs a lot into the last couple of hours with his disciples. But over and over, he keeps telling them, "if you love me you will keep my commandments."

We know the Father's commandments. They were given to Moses on stone tablets; ten of them, clear and concise – what to do and what not to do. But what is Jesus' commandment? We hear it in

this gospel reading. "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you."

Then he goes a step further. Jesus is not just asking his followers to obey a rule. He gives them a command for action. "This I command you: love one another."

On the surface, this seems so easy, right? When you are among your best friends, your brothers/sisters – love one another. But the fact is, this is probably the hardest commandment of all. We need to love as God loves us - always present, always open, always forgiving, in every instance, circumstance and event. Think about that.

## A message from our Associate Pastor



This weekend we celebrate First Communion for our parish. We congratulate all our Communicants and thank their parents, teachers and Catechist who prepared them for this glorious sacrament. Many might be wondering why we celebrate Communion in May and how can we better receive Our Lord. Philip Kosloski of Aleteia helps us answer these questions. In many Western countries, it has become an annual tradition to celebrate the First Communion of children during the months of April or May. Yet, this tradition is something relatively new and unique to the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church.

In the first few centuries of Christianity, the three sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist, were always celebrated together. This meant that adults, children and babies received all three sacraments when converting to Christianity.

Typically, this took place at the Easter Vigil, as it commonly occurs today in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Initially the bishop conferred these sacraments, but as Christianity spread in the West, bishops were no longer able to be physically present. This resulted in a separation of these sacraments in the Roman Rite, where baptism became a solitary sacrament administered by the priest or deacon and later on confirmation would be conferred when the bishop could travel to the parish. First Communion then came after confirmation and was often given to teenagers.

By the 19th century there developed an elaborate ceremony in many Western countries where all teenagers received First Communion together at the local parish, dressed in white garments that resembled their baptismal clothing.

This was the practice up until 1910, when Pope Pius X lowered the age of First Communion and encouraged young children to receive the Eucharist at age 7 or 8. Then instead of teenagers receiving First Communion at the parish, it changed to younger children.

The decision to host this ceremony in April or May is largely based on the celebration of Easter, which in some way connects it to the original tradition of receiving the sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Additionally, for many centuries the Church instructed its members to receive holy communion annually during the Easter season. The current Code of Canon Law highlights this "Easter obligation."

After being initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, each of the faithful is obliged to receive holy communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at another time during the year. (Can. 920)

Technically speaking, anyone can receive their First Communion, with the permission of their local pastor, at any time of the year. However, because of the Eucharist's close connection to the Easter season, it is most often celebrated on one of the Sundays following Easter.

The following are two prayers to help us receive Communion and after receiving contemplate this great gift. Our preparation for communion should be an integral part of our spiritual exercises, especially as the moment for reception nears.

Here is a brief prayer from The Glories of the Catholic Church to be said shortly before holy communion that invites Jesus into your heart.

One way to we invite God to flood your soul with peace is to recite this poem, found in the 19th-century devotional The Glories of the Catholic Church, after communion:

Come, dear Jesus, come and receive me; come and take possession of my soul and body; of my will, memory, and understanding; of my thoughts, words, and actions; of every look, step, breath and motion; in fine, of all that I am and have. Come and deliver me from all my spiritual enemies. Come, dear Jesus, and unite me strictly to you. I do now, my dearest Jesus, receive you in the best manner I can into this my poor heart: do you one day receive me into your heavenly habitation.

After receiving Our Lord we can invite God to flood your soul with peace is to recite this poem, found in the 19th-century devotional The Glories of the Catholic Church:

The happiness I now enjoy, With Jesus in my heart, The enemy can ne'er destroy, With all his wily art. The bliss that Jesus now impartsTo my enraptured soul, Is only felt by faithful hearts That sin cannot control. I feel my ardor now revive, With Jesus in my heart; In vain this world's allurements strive My Lord and I to part.

#### As I Love You

This week my children were learning about energy. We set up an experiment with toy cars — one was placed in front of another, and a third was pushed into the two stationary ones.

The forward motion caused the front car to move, but not much. "Most of the energy goes into the car in the middle, not the car on the end," my daughter concluded.

 ${\sf I}$  asked her why she seems to have so much energy, and  ${\sf I}$  seem to have so little.

"Because you're old," she replied confidently.

Most days I feel like that first car, barreling at life with all my energy and love and good intentions, only to have it almost entirely absorbed by the proverbial middle car. It's so easy to be discouraged. The devil so badly wants us to feel discouraged.

But the law of love is not unlike the law of conservation of energy. Love is neither created nor destroyed. It is only transferred from one form to another. And yes, sometimes it certainly seems like it disappears. It appears to get lost between my hands and the plate of dinner that goes uneaten or evaporates off of my lips as words I fear are never heard. It is spat upon as a commandment the world would prefer I do not keep.

But we are not called to simply love one another — to love when it seems effective and productive and appreciated. We are called to love as Christ loved: recklessly, selflessly, and yes, even without logic. We are called to love with a love that doesn't give up and is never withdrawn. A love that doesn't fear death or the world's hatred. A love that stands willing to argue, to be reviled, to be dismissed.

We are called to be that first car, hurtling ourselves against a world that isn't ready to accept or understand us. And we trust that, even when we can't see how, the love that seems to disappear simply changes forms.
