



## A message from our Pastor



Last weekend, over 80 children received the sacrament of First Holy Communion. It was a wonderful day filled with anticipation and joy after two years of sacramental preparation. A big thank you to our parents, godparents, catechists, and all those who have been so instrumental in helping these children reach this place in their faith journey. May all of us continue to nurture and grow in our love for and understanding of Jesus in our lives.

In an effort to encourage these families to continue growing together in faith and love for the Eucharist, today we celebrate "Second Communion". The children were invited to wear their special outfits and bring their families to Mass. We do not want First Communion to be Only Communion. If you know

families that celebrated this sacrament – family, friends, neighbors – at our parish or other parishes, reach out and invite them to Mass. Go to breakfast, lunch or dinner afterward and talk about how Jesus helps you through your days and brings you closer to God.

We who come to church and experience the joy of the Gospel and the soul filling nourishment of the Eucharist, are commanded by Jesus Christ to spread that joy and accompany others. By receiving the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Communion and Confirmation – parents, families and the whole church community make a commitment to learn, grow and help one another together! Let us be those disciples! And don't forget to ask the Holy Spirit to help; your prayers do not fall on deaf ears. Make this commitment today – pick one person (or family) and begin praying for them to open their hearts and come home to Jesus. This may not happen overnight and we of the instantaneous internet answers must practice trust and patience.

Speaking of patience - Happy Mother's Day! I know this day brings a mix of emotions for many people. There are those anticipating the birth of their first child, those who have the pain of not being able to bear children, step-moms wondering what their place is, and mothers who have lost their children. There are many (including me) who have lost their mothers and this day can be especially painful. As I have said before, I have had many people tell me over the years that this is one of the hardest Sundays to come to Mass. I invite all of us to pray this beautiful prayer by Daniel Darling to convey love and kindness to all the women in each of our lives who have helped guide us:

Lord, on this day in which we honor mothers, may we love and cherish the special women who have born us, who have nurtured us, and who have prayed for our well-being.

May our hearts overflow with gratitude to you, who formed and knitted each of us in a mother's womb.

## A message from our Associate Pastor



This Sunday, we celebrate as a country Mothers Day. It is a difficult time for some and we are encouraged to go to Our Lady, Our Mother during this time. Kathleen N. Hattrup of Aleteia explains Pope Francis' advice to turn to a unique manifestation of Our Lady in 1953, when an image of the Virgin was seen weeping. Speaking with representatives of the Sant'Angela Merici Foundation of Syracuse on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the founding, the Pope considered the meaning of Mary's tears, which are shed "for the sufferings and sorrows of her children."

Mary weeps for her children who suffer. They are tears that speak to us of God's compassion for us all. We must think about this: God's compassion. Indeed, He gave to all of us His Mother, who weeps our own tears so that we do not feel alone in difficult moments. At the same time, through the tears of the Blessed Virgin, the Lord wants to soften our hearts, which at times have dried up in indifference and hardened in selfishness; the Lord

wants to make our consciences sensitive, so that we let ourselves be touched by the pain of our brothers and sisters and move us to compassion for them, committing ourselves to lift them up, lift them up, accompany them. The Weeping Virgin of Syracuse is an image that was given to Antonina and Angelo lannuso for their wedding. On August 29, 1953, Antonina experienced blindness but when she regained her sight, she looked to the image and saw it weeping.

Pope Francis noted how Our Lady's tears are simply a reflection of her Son.

The Gospel is the source because Jesus was the first – let us not forget this – Jesus was the first to let Himself be touched to the core by the suffering of those He met and, as the evangelist John reminds us, "He was deeply moved" (Jn 11:33) by the death of His friend Lazarus.

At the same time, you are a living witness to this Gospel, to Jesus' compassion, when you strive to accompany those in pain, just as the Lord commanded His disciples to do when faced with the hungry, exhausted and oppressed crowds. For Jesus asks us never to separate love of God from love of neighbour, especially the poorest. Jesus reminds us that in the end we will be judged not on outward practices but on love – we will be judged on love – the love that, like oil of consolation, we will have been able to pour over the wounds of our brothers and sisters. He says: "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40).

The Pope prayed to Mary, calling her Our Lady of Tears, and asking her protection over the association.

Our Mother is a title given to Mary because she is the Mother of God and of the Church. Philip Kosloski of Aleteia has more about this title. St. Paul VI gave a lengthy explanation behind the title in his apostolic exhortation, Signum Magnum. His first point was to connect this title to Mary's role in the life of Christ.

The first truth is this: Mary is the Mother of the Church not only because she is the Mother of Christ and His most intimate associate in "the new economy when the Son of God took a human nature from her, that He might in the mysteries of His flesh free man from sin," but also because "she shines forth to the whole community of the elect as a model of the virtues." Indeed, just as no human mother can limit her task to the generation of a new man but must extend it to the function of nourishing and educating her offspring, thus the blessed Virgin Mary, after participating in the redeeming sacrifice of the Son, and in such an intimate way as to deserve to be proclaimed by Him the Mother not only of His disciple John but – may we be allowed to affirm it – of mankind which he in some way represents, now continues to fulfill from heaven her maternal function as the cooperator in the birth and development of divine life in the individual souls of redeemed men.

He then explains how Mary is Mother of the Church, even though she is no longer physically present on earth.

But in what way does Mary cooperate in the growth of the members of the Mystical Body in the life of grace? First of all, by her unceasing prayers inspired by a most ardent charity. The Holy Virgin, in fact, though rejoicing in the union of the august Trinity, does not forget her Son's advancing, as she herself did in the "pilgrimage of the faith". Indeed, contemplating them in God and clearly seeing their necessities, in communion with Jesus Christ, "who continues forever and is therefore able at all times to intercede for them," she makes herself their Advocate, Auxiliatrix, Adjutrix and Mediatrix.

Furthermore, Mary's role in the Church has been vital to the spread of Christianity since the very beginning.

On Pentecost, the "birthday of the Church," Mary was present with the apostles and likely guided them with a motherly care during those early days.

Mary was and still is the "Mother of the Church," a kind and gentle mother who cares for her spiritual children throughout their entire lives.

### The Truth We Cannot See

I only pray out loud when I want my kids to hear what I'm saying.

I know what you're thinking — hypocrites in the synagogue and the street corner; go to your room and shut the door — but I think if Jesus had to raise children he would understand where I'm coming from. I pray out loud not because I want my kids to think I'm holy and not because I want them to admire me but because I want them to know how broken I am, how desperately I rely on the mercy and love of God.

It's also a really effective way to send a message. "God, I'm sorry I've been losing my patience today. Please help me. And send your Holy Spirit to make these kids stop fighting.'

Vocal prayer, in front of other people, is an incredibly vulnerable action, so it strikes me whenever Jesus chooses to pray out loud in front of his disciples. Surely, mental prayer was something of a perpetual state for him. I imagine Jesus was ceaselessly in conversation with his Father in heaven throughout even the most ordinary of days. So, when he chooses to make those communications public, my ears perk up.

He wants his kids to hear what he's saying.

In John, chapter 17, we see that he wants us to remember who we are. His disciples are about to see things that will shake the very foundations of their faith. The only way they will make it to the other side is if they remember that truth does not consist only of what we can see with our

This is the same truth in which we have been consecrated. We belong to this truth in a way the world will never understand or accept. It is the truth we cannot see

"I gave them your word, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world." John 17:14.

## BETHLEHEM ART SALE





### All God's Children Are Made Perfectly!


SPRED (SPecial REligious Development) prepares those with special needs for Liturgical life.



Cost: \$550/semester plus fees (we encourage all parishes to seek any available budget funds to support your parishioner's faith formation and provide some type of scholarship. If extra funds are needed that the applicant cannot cover, USML has limited funds available for further financial assistance).


