A message from our Associate Pastor



We are in the middle of graduation and for Catholics ordination season, congratulations to Fr. Timothy Berryhill and all the newly ordained. Tom Hoops of Aleteia highlights a commencement speech from Harrison Butker, the Super Bowl winning kicker for the Kansas City Chiefs at Benedictine College in Atchison, Kansas, on May 11.

He had a lot to say about politics, liturgy, and Church governance, but he repeatedly pointed out that it was important that people "stay in your lane." What is Butker's lane? "Faith, family and football ... in that order," is how he put it on campus previously.

Thoughts he shared about those three topics were truly the highlights of his remarks. "Faith" means your state in life, he said.

After dwelling on things he found troublesome in the Church and in the world, Butker offered a strong antidote.

He said there were "great examples right here on this very campus who will keep the light of Christ

burning bright for generations to come."

At his commencement address last year at Georgia Tech, he told seniors to get married and have children. To the Catholic students in the Kansas City, Kansas, archdiocese he added a few more vocations.

"Being locked in with your vocation and staying in your lane is going to be the surest way for you to find true happiness and peace in this life," he said. "It is essential that we focus on our own state in life, whether that be as a layperson, a priest, or religious, ladies and gentlemen of the class of 2024."

And he had plenty of advice for fellow laypeople. "Family" was important for everyone, he said.

He congratulated the women present for "an amazing accomplishment," saying, "You should be proud of all that you have achieved to this point in your young lives."

Family is a crucial part of every lay person's story, he added.

"Some of you may go on to lead successful careers in the world," he said. "But I would venture to guess that the majority of you are most excited about your marriage and the children you will bring into this world."

On the day before Mother's Day, he said, "I can tell you that my beautiful wife Isabelle would be the first to say that her life truly started when she began living her vocation as a wife and as a mother. I'm on this stage today able to be the man I am because I have a wife who leans into her vocation."

Then, he had to choke back tears to finish when he added: "I'm beyond blessed with the many talents God has given me. But it cannot be overstated that all of my success is made possible because the girl I met in class back in middle school would convert to the faith, become my wife, and embrace one of the most important titles of all: homemaker."

The two attended Georgia Tech together. Butker said, "Isabelle's dream of having a career might not have come through. But if you ask her today if she has any regrets on her decision, she would laugh out loud without hesitation and say, "Heck no!"

"Family" was key for the men in the audience, too, he said.

"I have leaned into my vocation as a husband and as a father," he said. "What plagues our society today is the lie that has been told that men are not necessary in the home or in our communities."

He acknowledged that men who have abandoned families and responsibilities have helped create this misunderstanding.

"Never settle for what is easy," he said. "You might have a talent that you don't necessarily enjoy, but if it glorifies God, maybe you should lean into that, over something that you might think suits you better. I speak from experience as an introvert who now finds myself as an amateur public speaker and an entrepreneur — something I never thought I'd be when I received my industrial engineering degree."

Last, "football" came up several times in his speech.

Butker's kicking records were read out in his introduction: Longest Chiefs field goal, longest Super Bowl field goal, the high scorer in the most recent Super Bowl and the game-winning field goal in the one before that.

Butker acknowledged several times that it is only his football prowess that has gained him a platform.

Regarding his honorary degree and his football nickname, he said, "I think I need to tell them to stop calling me 'Butt-kicker' and say 'Dr. Butker'!"

He mentioned his NFL job again when he was speaking about his wife. "She is the one who ensures I never let football or my business become a distraction from being a husband and father," he said. And third, he mentioned Catholic football.

"I thank God for Benedictine College and for the example it provides to the world," he said. "You can have an authentically Catholic college and a thriving football program."

He concluded with a call to service.

"Make no mistake you are entering into mission territory in a 'post-god' world," he said. "But you were made for this and with God by your side and a constant striving for virtue within your vocation you too can be a saint. Christ is King — to the heights!"

REFLECTIONS

You Don't Have What It Takes - but You Will

Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.

We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we're supposed to do, in any situation. It's that feeling of: Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can't.

We've all got our list of reasons why not, don't we? We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I'm not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don't want to come across as pushy. I'm not going to make amends with my cousin because she'll just walk all over me again. I'm not going to say a Rosary tonight because I'm tired and it'll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of "reasons why we can't" together, I don't think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles. Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven't been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages. Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades?

But even that big, giant, stop-you-dead-in-your tracks Reason Why We Can't was nothing, because God had a plan. He didn't call a bunch of equipped men. He called them, and He equipped them. Cue the tongues of fire!

God doesn't call us to do His will because we have what it takes. He calls us because He's ready to give us what it takes. Being a good steward is to answer the call of Christ knowing he will provide. By Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

CONGRATULATIONS TO FR. TIMOTHY BERRYHILL ON HIS ORDINATION TO THE PRIESTHOOD

Cardinal Blase Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, will ordain candidates from Mundelein Seminary to the Priesthood at Holy Name Cathedral.

"The new priests join a brotherhood which enhances their ability to bring renewal, joy and comfort to those in need of guidance, healing and mercy." Cardinal Blase J. Cupich

Men become priests through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, a celebration rich in symbolism and tradition. At the center of ordination is the moment when Cardinal Cupich imposes his hands on the candidates' heads and prays over them, asking that God grant them an outpouring of the Holy Spirit for the ministry that they will undertake as priests. After the new priests are clothed in their vestments, Cardinal Cupich anoints their hands with oil, hand them the chalice and paten for the celebration of the Eucharist, and gives to each one the sign of peace.

By ordination, priests receive a wide variety of responsibilities, particularly celebrating the Mass and granting forgiveness of sins through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Priests also preach the Gospel, and celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Matrimony, and Anointing of the Sick. Diocesan priests make promises of life-long celibacy, prayer for the People of God, and obedience to their bishop at their ordination.

May the Lord guide them in their faithful service to our local Church.


MAY 29 - THE FEAST OF ST. PAUL VI

A novena is a nine-day prayer that you typically say to a specific saint for a special intention. Some people add on extra practices like fasting or acts of service to deepen their novena experience!

Praying a novena is especially powerful when you have an important intention. Here are some tips for how to pray a novena:

- Pick an intention for your novena.
- Set aside a specific time each day to pray the novena prayer. It's helpful to set a reminder on your phone or add it to your calendar ahead of time.
- Begin your novena on May 21 and end on the Feast Day of St. Paul VI. You can also begin your novena on the feast day on May 29.
- Each day, find a quiet place to pray where you will not be disturbed.
- Recite the prayer on the opposite of the card. (Prayer cards will be available to pick up in our churches and at the office beginning this weekend.)
- Repeat for nine days.


