

And most of all, give them ability to love in a way that reflects your love.


Amen.

A message from our Associate Pastor



As a priest, I am aware of the countless people of God within our parish community who pray for me and Fr. Tom as well as all the priests who serve our community. Individuals on Twitter, like Kathryn Jean Lopez and Edith (CatolicaEdith), inspire me by their posts.

Recently, Lopez tweeted: "If you go to Mass today, thank the priest. Fr. Edward Looney continues to talk about how we pray for priests. We need faithful priests. Pray for his holiness. Pray that he can know and show the Lord every day of his life. Faithful, joyful priests in this culture are miracles, too. Pray for priests, that Jesus Christ is their everything."

Edith once tweeted a picture of a prayer a person could pray for a priest as he receives Holy Communion:

O Lord, may Thou find shelter and rest gently within the heart of thy Priest. Make him, O Lord, a priest according to thy Heart: meek, humble, zealous, so that all he does will be for

Thine honor and glory. Mold him into a man of prayer and labor, insensible to earthly things, and sensible only to Thy love and to the graces of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

How beautiful — an encouragement to pray for priests and a prayer one could use to do so.Do you pray for priests? If so, how do you pray? Which priests do you pray for and what do you pray?

You might pray for priests who are close to your heart — the priest who baptized you, who gave you First Communion, who forgives your sins in confession, who witnessed your marriage, your pastor, or any other priest friend. Thank God for them and their vocation.

How do you pray for them? You may wish to include them in your Rosary intentions, or ask priestly saints like St. John Vianney, St. Francis de Sales, or St. John Eudes to pray for them. And maybe you pray for something specific when you remember your priest(s) in prayer. As you pray for the priests in your life, here are a few suggestions.

- For his happiness and that he may be well-rested: Pray that your priest is happy and he finds things that give him life. Pray that he takes his days off and vacation so that he is well-rested.
- That he be blessed with good friends: Pray that your priest has good fraternity and friendships with priests but also with lay people, too.
- That he live a virtuous life and grow in virtue patience, humility, purity, charity, etc.
- That he will be compassionate in his pastoral work.
- That God will give him specific gifts, like offering good counsel in the confessional Read more: 'How truly difficult it is to let ourselves be loved!' Read the pope's moving message before confession.
- That the Lord keep him faithful and holy and that he will always remain in love with the Lord Jesus and the Church.
- For protection from evil, to be guarded against temptation, and for continued conversion of life.
- That he will be inspired by the Holy Spirit in his preaching and that his preaching will be effective, touch hearts, and change lives.
- For his spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical health and for any healings he needs.
- For his intentions: Pray for God's will to be done in all the circumstances your priest is praying about. And as you remember his intentions, know that so many have asked him to pray for them, so your prayer for his intentions will be joined to theirs!

As I encourage you to pray for the clergy, know that your priests are praying for you too. They remember you in their prayers as they pray the Liturgy of the Hours, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy chaplet, and other devotions. They carry your needs and burdens with them and leave them before the tabernacle.

Thank you for your prayers for holy priests!

Divine Savior, Jesus Christ, who has entrusted the whole work of your redemption, the welfare and salvation of the world, to priests as your representatives, I offer you through the hands of your most Holy Mother Mary, this present day, whole and entire, with all its prayers, works, and sacrifices, its joys and sorrows, for the sanctification of your priests, and for all those preparing for the priesthood.

Give us truly holy priests, inflamed with the fire of your divine love, who seek nothing but your greater glory, and the salvation of souls.

And you, Mary, good Mother of priests, protect all priests from dangers to their holy vocation, and with the loving hand of a mother, lead back to the Good Shepherd those unfortunate priests who, unfaithful to their exalted vocation, have gone astray. Amen.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

My mother and father fell in love with each other rather quickly. It was only a span of two months between their first meeting and quiet betrothal. They waited for a significant period of time before going public with the happy news. It simply wasn't time. Love's strength and speed can sprout scandal in public. Until the big reveal, they gave the outside world only little hints, gestures, and riddles.

Something like this — but even more wonderful — is at play when Mark says of Jesus, "he did not speak to them without a parable, but to his disciples in private he explained everything." Jesus is the long-awaited messiah-king, but his identity as the Lord and Son of God is so new, surprising, and scandalous to human ears that the big reveal would have to wait. Thus, his parables are riddles, meant to conceal more than reveal. Even the disciples — who hear things explained directly — barely grasp what he is up to. It's only at the cross that Jesus' love for Israel and the world is explicitly revealed. Until then, much stays hidden and comes in riddles.

So it goes with us, too. I wonder at times why doesn't the Lord just speak to us directly in prayer about what we should do, or how to fix our problems. Or why doesn't he reveal himself directly to powerful leaders who are slow to act? Why does he allow life so often to be confounding, contradictory, and crazy? Because it simply isn't time yet. One glorious day, it will be. Until then, he teaches us in riddles, and only sometimes explains them. ©LPi



St. Paul VI Parish Migrant Ministry Update on the Herrera Family

It has been less than six months since St. Paul VI Parish began the journey with Jose, Andreina and their children, Andrexis and Jeremías. Through their own determination and persistence and the guidance of

several parishioners, they are adjusting to their new lives. A lot has happened! In this short period of time, TPS (temporary protective status) was quickly granted. Social security numbers (for all four) have been issued. Jose and Andreina have work permits! They are both actively seeking employment. They are in the application process for asylum status. Working in our government system takes much focus and perseverance!

Andreina takes English classes four nights a week and shares her studies with Jose. Their English skills are coming along well. Jose also received a transition driver's license and will soon take the road test! This will open more job options for him. Andrexis, age 13, finished 8th grade and is looking forward to summer fun. Jeremías, age 6, graduated from kindergarten and will play Little League baseball.

The family is extremely grateful for all the support and assistance. They are diligent in their quest to become independent. Until then, they need our help. Parishioners have assisted with appointments, writing resumes, connecting them to the community, and weekly grocery shopping. Purchasing household goods in the local stores can be quite pricey. To help offset this cost, we are asking for donations of some of the more frequently used items. A Sign-Up Genius has been created to help offset this expense.


