Dear Katrina,

I have two questions for you. What are the reasons for frequent priestly reassignments? We seem to get a new priests at our parish every three years or so. Also, what is the best way to welcome our new priest? I would like to do something nice to make him feel welcomed. Ideas?

### Dear M.M.R,

Both are great questions.

I asked a few priest friends of mine what are some ways their congregation can make them feel welcome and their replies were as varied as their personalities. Most suggested inviting Father over for dinner, but keep in mind that some priests may be more introverted or extremely busy settling into their new assignment. Feeding Father seemed to be the most suggested and welcomed advice, though, because who doesn't appreciate a nice meal? My favorite comment came from a local priest who said "If you feed me, I'll remember your name." Tip noted, padre.

There were also a few suggestions that a nice card welcoming the priest was a genuine and simple effort they often appreciated. You could even slip in a \$10 gift card for gas or coffee in the card. It doesn't need to be an extravagant effort to still be sincere. Other ideas included spiritual bouquets (like this beautiful example) or offering to help out or volunteer at the parish.

Now let me add how to make a priest NOT feel welcome. Don't tell Father "This is how it's always been done" or "That's not how Fr. Previous Priest used to do things." Don't complain to other parishioners or publicly voice your objections if the new priest does something you don't like or don't agree with; basically don't be a gossip. Patiently give each new priest the chance to find his footing in this new environment. Patience is probably the best gift you could give to any new priest.

As for your other questions, there can be several reasons for reassigning a priest to a new parish and the frequency in which it's done varies from diocese to diocese. In my own diocese, pastor reassignments happen every six years and in other dioceses it can be without any terms at all. When it's without terms a pastor can request to stay or be reassigned with the bishop giving the final approval.

For the parochial vicar, or assistant pastor, they typically have no terms and can be moved around more frequently, generally every 1-3 years. I've been told the reason for this frequency is so they can gain experience in preparation for their more permanent role as pastor. The circulation of priests typically serves practical reasons. It helps priests broaden their experience and perspectives but it also can prevent cults of personality from forming around priests.

I know reassignments can be stressful for all involved, the priest and the congregation, and adjusting to change can be harder for some than others. Some priests transition with little effort and some parishioners can become very anxious when they receive word that a priest they've become attached to is moving. We could argue either way about the necessity for such frequent change. But in the end, it's important to remember that the main relationship is always between the People of God and Jesus Christ.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE By Father John Muir

#### 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Right now, you and I are only worried about one of only two things: wind or water. Bear with me. This week we hear the account of the terrified disciples waking Jesus in a sea-storm. He chastises them for their lack of faith, and then, "rebuking the wind, he said to the sea, 'Quiet, be still!'" He rebukes the wind and stills the water. In the Bible wind and water represent the two most fundamental poles of our experience of creation. Wind means heaven, spirit, that which gives identity, unity, order, light. Water stands for earth, variation, potential, that which can be drawn into identity, darkness, chaos.

Too much "wind" is when things get way too rigid, abstract and ideological — when we face oppressive leaders and tyrants, when we get addicted to our own way of doing things, when our attention is too narrowly focused on one thing. Too much "water" is excessive novelty, passivity, indifference, and chaos — when our attention is too broadly diffused on many things, when things seem to be crumbling without direction into the dark abyss. We know both terrifying experiences all too well.

The point of the miracle is that God in Christ is the One who brings final cosmic harmony between these two vital but threatening forces. He ultimately does so from the wood of the cross, when he breathes forth the wind of his spirit and pours forth the water from his side to establish a new creation, filled with harmonious peace. ### Sue Jones: St. Paul VI 2024 Woman of the Year

On June 5, the St. Paul VI Women's Society honored Sue Jones as its 2024 Woman of the Year! Sue has been a leading light in parish life, Catholic Charities projects, and humanitarian causes. She is a true servant leader.

Sue has been a committed parishioner of St. Mary and now St. Paul VI since 1987. An active member of our Women's Society, she is always there to help with our events and projects and to share her talents and friendship.

Notably, Sue has chaired the Parish Pastoral Council since 2022. She has served on the Service Outreach Committee (originally called the Social Action Committee) since 2002. For 12 years, she has co-chaired Parish Action Day, a morning of fellowship and service sponsored by the Service Outreach Committee.

Sue's volunteer work with Catholic Charities includes co-chairing our parish's monthly sponsorship of a Tuesday Supper, feeding more than 150 working poor and needy seniors in Cicero and the surrounding area. Sue has also chaired

other Catholic Charities projects, such as collection drives for food, coats, and cleaning supplies.

Sue's humanitarian efforts have reached beyond our area. In 2005, she served as St. Mary's representative on a Riverside Covenant of Churches project to relocate a family from Hurricane Katrina to a rental home in Maywood, for which they collected and delivered furniture, appliances, and household items. Later, she served on St. Mary's Refugee Committee for 5 years, helping legal refugees from Iraq, Afghanistan, Myanmar, and the Republic of the Congo as part of the Catholic Charities Refugee Resettlement Program.

Sue and her husband, Jerry, have lived in Riverside for 37 years, raising their three sons. She worked at Marshall Field's for 21 years as Group Manager of Food Manufacturing. For the next 21 years, Sue held a variety of positions at DesignPac, a gourmet gift division of 1800flowers.com. She retired as Director of Merchandising in 2019. She also served as a volunteer with Boy Scout Pack/ Troop 24 for 18 years.

We are clearly blessed to have Sue Jones as a treasured friend and member of our Society and parish. We confer this well-deserved distinction with our gratitude and affection. Congratulations, Sue!
