A message from our Pastor



Thank you to everyone who came out last Sunday to wish Fr. Matt the best of luck on his new assignment; I know that he was most appreciative of the love and support. Let us keep him in our prayers this week as he officially begins his new role tomorrow, July 1, and settles into his new place of residence at St. Stephen.

Tomorrow is a big day for St. Paul VI parish as we officially welcome our newly ordained Associate Pastor, Fr. Tim Berryhill! Fr. Tim will begin saying weekend masses July 6-7. There will be a very casual Meet & Greet the next 2 Sundays. On Sunday, July 7, lemonade and cookies will be served in the

Oak Room after the 10 AM Mass on the St. Mary campus. On Sunday July 14 cookies and lemonade will be served in the Marian Room after the 9:30 AM Mass on the Mater Christi campus. I know Fr. Tim is looking forward to meeting his new parishioners and starting his first assignment. As Bishop Timothy Lyne said many years ago, "For every priest, his first assignment has a special place in his heart. ...so the first people to call me 'Father' will always be a part of my life." Bishop Lyne served at St. Mary for 19 years and was part of the history of the newly formed Mater Christi Church. As a matter of fact, Fr. Lyne as he was known back then, was present at the dedication of Mater Christi Church June 28, 1953. By Cardinal Stritch.

Some may call it a coincidence that our new parish now has its own Fr. Tim, but I am much more inclined to believe that it is the Holy Spirit at work! I know he is going to be a wonderful blessing to all of us as we continue to become the vibrant faith community that our Savior Jesus Christ needs us to be! Fr. Tim will be living at the St. Mary Rectory and will have an office at the Lyne Pastoral Center located at 40 E. Burlington, Riverside.

The Mater Christi Rectory and campus are abuzz with activity! As of July 1, three priests will be living in the rectory: Fr. Laurent Mhagama, Fr. Emmanuel Offiong and Fr. Neil Fackler. Fr. Laurent is currently serving as chaplain at several area hospitals and many of you may have met him as he has been filling in for Masses and confessions at St Paul VI. Fr. Emmanuel Offiong is here with us from Iowa until August 15, as he is currently enrolled at a class on the Loyola Hospital campus. Some of you may know Fr. Neil Fackler, who was most recently Pastor of Mary, Mother of Divine Grace in Westchester. Fr. Fackler stepped down as Pastor, due to some recent health issues, and is very thankful to be welcomed here to continue his journey of recuperation. I got to know Fr. Fackler in my role as Dean and I am grateful that our parish has the resources available to be able to offer to fellow priests in times of transition.

On another note, as many of you may be aware, the North Riverside Players rent space on the Mater Christi campus to safely store props and costumes. A classroom in the school has been used for this purpose for the past several years. However, with the growing faith formation programs, the decision was made to clear out the classroom and move the theater rental space to the old Mater Christi parish office space in the rectory basement. Lots of things going on as we begin our 4th year as St. Paul VI Parish!

Speaking of the 4th – Happy 4th of July! Stay safe, have fun and I look forward to seeing you at the parades!

A message from our Associate Pastor



My mom is often on a mission when a newly ordained priest celebrates Mass. She is happy to be at Mass but when Mass has ended she always waits for the newly ordained. The main reason is not get a first blessing. No, it is not because I didn't bless her correctly when I was first ordained, but that she might receive the special blessing that only a newly ordained can give. For the first blessing, you would ask the priest, in this case, Fr. Tim, to bless you, kneeling or standing, you would receive the pouring forth of the blessing. Finally, after the blessing, you can kiss the priest's hands in honor that they have been consecrated and newly anointed with the Sacred Chrism. Please after the blessing thank the priest for the blessing and for his

ministry. Fr. Taylor Colwell of Aleteia helps us understand how a newly ordained feels when giving a blessing.

One of the most impactful aspects of being a newly ordained priest is the opportunity to give first blessings. This typically begins immediately after priestly ordination, when many of the faithful line up to receive from the new priest words of peace spoken over outstretched hands recently anointed with sacred chrism — hands set apart as Christ's instruments to bless and sanctify.

While I knew it would be moving to bless family members and friends, I was surprised by the number of strangers who approached me. Many of them came with special requests for prayers: for their families, for themselves, for healing, peace, conversion, and other needs. These were intimate moments, in which I was invited to step into the dialogue of faith and trust between Jesus and his people, as one chosen to be his representative in their midst. My new configuration to Jesus was palpable as, like the master during his earthly ministry, crowds gathered to seek his attention to their needs and burdens.

The experience of first blessings is certainly a witness to the power of the ministerial priesthood. It is also, however, a witness to the profound solidarity that exists among us all, manifested whenever we share our burdens with others in request for prayer. Solidarity is a feature of our common humanity, which binds us together in the shared vulnerability of human beings in a world that is difficult and fallen. This sharing is intensified by the sacramental bonds of baptism and the Eucharist, that make us one in the Body of Christ that is the Church. Thus can St. Paul conclude, "If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together" (1 Cor 12:26).

The experience of imparting priestly blessings is a special one, yet it also exemplifies the power of prayer in general to bring together people, who would otherwise be strangers, into an intimate sharing of spiritual goods. We all have the power to give and receive blessing. We bless and are blessed by owning our common vulnerability as human beings and as Christians, by sharing each other's burdens, and by interceding before the Lord on each other's behalf. Wherever you may be in your journey of faith, whatever the needs and prayers you have to contribute to our common spiritual treasury, I encourage you to harness this power.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE By Father John Muir

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sin isn't given its due these days. Downplaying sin is dangerous. But there is also another spiritual misstep in which we make way too big a deal out of sin. It happens, for example, when we persistently wonder if our confessed sins are "really" forgiven, or suspiciously ponder what God "really" thinks about us, behind His merciful face. Or when someone returns to Church, and we question whether his or her conversion was genuine. Or when we commit some sin and put on a sad face for days, thinking, "Maybe my sins are too great for God to deal with." God save us from that attitude!

Well, he does just that, this week, in the raising of Jairus' daughter. The dead twelve-year-old's house is filled with a spirit of excessive moaning and groaning, tumultuous weeping and wailing. They even laugh at Jesus in a mocking tone. It's shocking how easy it is for him to raise the dead child. It is equivalent to gently waking a kid from a light nap. And then he sends her off to get some lunch. No big whoop. The overactive drama is actually part of the problem, and removing it is a key part of the miracle.

Friends, sin can and does kill, but Jesus is always ready and able to raise us back to life, often without much hullabaloo. His ease of forgiving should never be a pretext for presumption, minimizing sin, or taking lightly the cost he pays for our sins on the cross. But for God's sake, we often need Jesus to put out the weepers and wailers. He's the Lord. And remember, the girl is not dead, she's just sleeping. ©LPi

Turkey and Syria are situated in a region that experiences frequent, major earthquakes. In early February 2023, central Turkey's most powerful earthquake since 1939 struck with a magnitude of 7.8. More than 10,000 aftershocks continued for weeks afterward, including a powerful magnitude 6.4 aftershock that struck the biblical city of Antioch, known as Antakya. More than 50,000 people in Turkey and neighboring Syria were killed by the initial earthquake, followed by more deaths and the destruction of structures damaged by the first earthquake. UN officials estimated that more than 1.5 million people were left homeless in what is believed to be the largest natural disaster in Turkey's history.

In a mid-February meeting with Turkey's new ambassador to the Holy See, Pope Francis asked what sort of aid Turkey most needed. Within 24 hours, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, the papal almoner and prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for the Service of Charity, organized a shipment of canned food, diapers, thermal garments, and other necessities, to be sent from Rome to a warehouse in Turkey for distribution to those in need. At the same time, economic aid to Syrian victims was entrusted to the apostolic nunciature in Syria. In addition to this material relief, the Vatican's prefect for the Dicastery for the Eastern Churches, Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti, visited Syria and Turkey to provide a ministry of presence to victims.

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, the poor, and those affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by your contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you participate in the collection, you join Catholics across the globe in supporting the pope's mission of mercy as well as the Holy See dicasteries that assist his ministry.
