A message from our Pastor



Now that the 4th of July has come and gone, vacation season is in full swing. People are packing up their cars and driving to places all over our beautiful country; others are packing suitcases and flying to destinations around the world. No matter where you go, all vacations take an enormous amount of planning, coordination, and preparation. Cars need to be tuned up for long distance drives or flights booked, accommodations finalized, suitcases packed with all clothing and essentials, care for pets arranged and don't forget the phone chargers! It's a lot of work to go relax!

It's amazing then to listen to the words of today's Gospel detailing how Jesus sends out the Apostles – the Twelve – to preach repentance, heal the sick and drive out demons. They were sent two by two, with nothing more than a walking stick, the sandals on their feet and the clothes on their backs. Nothing else. No food, no sack, no money, not even an extra tunic. They didn't know where they would eat or sleep or even if they would be welcomed by those they encountered, and yet, they went.

Admittedly, we have a lot more "stuff" than the fishermen of Judea, but I am sure that even way back when these directions must have seemed crazy to the Apostles. Mark's gospel writing does not tell us if the Apostles questioned Jesus or talked among themselves whether or not this seemed like a good idea. It just states that "they went off and preached repentance." They did what Jesus asked them to do.

This is not really a story about material possessions; rather it is about trust and faith. When Jesus called his Apostles, when he chose them to be the students for the most important class ever taught, he asked them to leave what they knew and believed behind and be the followers that he needed to accomplish his work on earth.

The lives of the saints show us that God is still asking us to do this. Think of the stories and the works of St. Damien, Mother Teresa, St Frances Xavier Cabrini, to name just a few. As a follower of Jesus Christ, are you listening for Jesus' instructions of how you can make a difference in the world? Will you do it, even if you have no idea how it will work, just trusting that if God needs your hands, your feet, your voice, your faith in him that it will happen according to his plan?

It's a lot to ponder, but perhaps when you are away from your everyday life and are sitting by a quiet lake, or gazing at a night sky filled with stars, or walking down a very old street in a faraway place you can listen for God's voice and hear what he is asking you to do and where you need to go to do his work. (He might even let you take your cell phone!)

Theology of the Home Part 1: House Blessings

In the gospels Jesus encounters people in a variety of places, but one of his favorite places is in their home. We can think of when the tax collector Zacchaeus climbed the sycamore tree to get a better look at Jesus and Jesus told him to come down so that they can go into his home to eat and talk. Or think of the time when Jesus raised the young daughter of Jairus from the dead in her home. Jesus even met with a Pharisee in his home. Jesus often met with people at great peril to his public reputation in their homes because they were sinners, but it is

because they were sinners that meeting them in their home was all the more important.

We often think of Church as the brick and mortar structure that we go to for an hour on Sundays. There are 168 hours in a week, but Jesus doesn't just want your attention for one of those 168 hours. The Church and our Catholic faith can and should take root in every part of our lives and it starts in our homes. For the next few weeks I will be writing my bulletin articles on the theology of the home: how we can sanctify our living spaces and allow the faith to dwell in our daily lives. I firmly believe that our homes are little churches, little seminaries, and little convents where we can live the way, the truth, and the life practically.

According to a study in 2023 the average person spends about 18 hours and 43 minutes at home each day. With the advent of remote working this number may very well go up in the years to come. We spend a significant amount of our time at home. It makes sense that we would want to sanctify our homes as a place where the faith can take root.

One of the ways that we can sanctify our homes is a house blessing. A blessing sanctifies something and sets it aside for a sacred purpose. It can be hard to think of our homes as a sacred place with all the turmoil and busyness of our everyday lives, but this is all the more reason to get your house blessed. Holiness is for every part of our life, even the messy parts.

A house blessing does not take very long, maybe 15 to 20 minutes, but it can help to reshape the way that we think about home and how we live our faith. A house blessing involves prayer, a reading from sacred scripture, intercessions asked for the good of the household, and a blessing of the rooms with holy water. It's a simple thing that can make a big difference in the spirituality of your home and be a catalyst to common holiness. The Second Vatican Council in its constitution Lumen Gentium spoke at length about the universal call to holiness, that all believers in Jesus Christ are called to holiness regardless of their vocation. In the same way our homes can be holy too. Our homes can be touchpoints to a life in Christ.

If you would like your house blessed let's book an appointment for me to come by.




Have you registered for the annual Golden Wedding Anniversary Mass?
